#### The Importance of a Personal Support Network

The American Red Cross and MEMA (Massachusetts Emergency Management Administration) recommend the following:

- 1. Make arrangements, <u>prior to an emergency</u>, for your support network to immediately check on you after a disaster and, if needed, offer assistance.
  - Ask an out-of-state friend or relative to serve as your family's emergency contact. After a disaster, it is sometimes easier to call long distance to unaffected areas.
  - Provide every family member with the name, address, and phone number of the emergency contact and make sure each family member has a cellphone or a prepaid phone card.
- 2. Share copies of your relevant emergency documents, evacuation plans and emergency health information card.
- 3. Agree on and practice methods for contacting each other in an emergency. Do not count on the telephones working. Even "hard-wired" phones may not be guaranteed if you have digital service. Contact your phone service provider to ask if a standard, hard-wired phone will work in a power outage.
  - Reminder: Your cell phone can be charged with a car charger. Have one available in case of emergency.
- 4. You and your personal support network should always notify each other when you are going out of town and when you will return.

#### **Provide Evacuation Information**

- Identify and practice how you will exit your home.
- Establish possible evacuation routes to ensure you are able to get to designated meeting locations.
  - ⇒ Talk to the Town Police Department to learn about evacuation routes.
- Identify available modes of transportation.
- Make arrangements with family, neighbors, friends, or local government if you don't have personal transportation.
  - $\Rightarrow$  If you need assistance, contact local public safety officials to make them aware of your needs.

- Q. What radio station carries Town emergency announcements?
- A. WBSM 1420 AM and WFHN 107.1 FM
- Q. Where is the shelter and how do I know when it is open?
- A. The shelter is in the Old Rochester Regional High School, 135 Marion Rd., Mattapoisett
  - Notification to the public will be made if the shelter will be open.
- Q. What if I cannot drive myself to the shelter?
- A. Depending on the emergency, there may be Town transportation. Police will assist, when available, with transportation.
- Q. Will the shelter accept my pet?
- A. Yes. Pets must be crated. Owners are responsible for caring for their pets at the shelter. Pets will not be in the same room with people. There is a separate pet room.
- Q. "Reverse 911" is capable for land lines, but is there a "Reverse 911" for cell phones?
- A. The Mattapoisett Police Dept. website has information on CODE RED alerts. Go to mattapoisettpolice.com, select "Forms", select "Code Red" and then select "Click Here" to fill out the form.
  - The Mattapoisett COA can assist with setting up your CODE RED. Please call the COA at 508.758.4110 before the storm is in the area
- Q. I live alone and/or in an isolated location. Is there a list that I can get on to have someone do a "Wellness Check" on me, especially in an emergency?
- A. You may register on the "Police Reassurance Plan." To lean more about the plan, contact the Mattapoisett Police Dept. (508.758.4141) or the Council on Aging (508.758.4110).
